Skijoring is allowed Sunday through Thursday after 12 p.m. and all day on Wednesday.

Skijoring is only allowed on the following groomed Nordic trails at Mt. Spokane State Park: Linder Ridge, Mica Road, Lower Tripp's, and Upper Tripp's (uphill only).

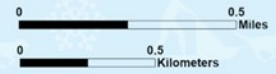
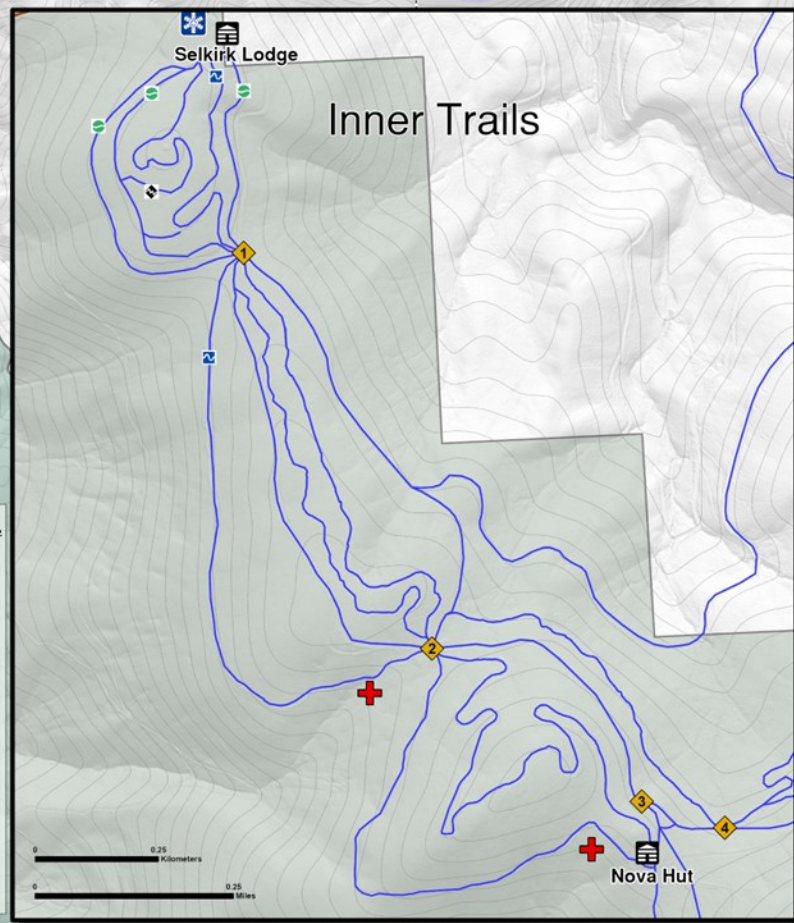
Dogs and humans are allowed to use the warming hut at Tripp's Knob. Signs are posted at the relevant intersections.

Skijoring Rules:
 Dogs must be on a harness and attached to the human skier at all times. A dog leashed on a collar and running with a skier is not allowed.

Dog owners are responsible to ski under control, and to keep their dogs under control, at all times.

When meeting and/or passing other skiers, the skier and the dog must be together on the same side of the trail.

Dog owners must pick up and carry out dog waste.
