THINGS TO REMEMBER

- Park hours are 6:30 a.m. to dusk. April 1 to October 31.
- Winter schedule: November 1 to March 31, 8 a.m. to dusk. For information about seasonal closures, visit parks.wa.gov.
- Reservations can be made up to nine months ahead online at <u>washington.goingtocamp.com</u> or by calling 888-CAMPOUT. Unreserved sites are available first come, first served year-round (site information available at the registration booth). Moorage is not guaranteed with camping reservation.
- There's a 10-day camping limit between April 1 and Sept. 30. The rest of the year is a 20-day limit.
- Wildlife, plants and all park buildings, signs, tables and other structures are protected; removal or damage of any kind is prohibited.
- Hunting, feeding of wildlife and gathering firewood on state park property is prohibited.
 Fallen branches and debris need to be left on the forest floor to decay and nourish the plants and trees. Firewood is for sale at the Ranger office.
- One camping party (west side is 6 max and main side is 8 max) per site. Campsites may not be held for other parties.
- Camping check-in time is 2:30 p.m. and check-out time is 1 p.m.
- No garbage services available. Take all garbage and recyclables when you depart and dispose of properly on mainland. Do not burn in fire pits. Bear boxes are available to store food at each site.
- Pets must be on leash and under control at all times. This includes trail areas and campsites. Pet owners must clean up after pets on all state park lands. Doggy bags are located throughout the park.
- Engine-driven electric generators may be operated only between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 p.m.
- Moorage fees are charged year round for mooring at dock, floats and buoys from 1 p.m. to 8 a.m.


Blake Island offers a change of pace not far from Seattle. This destination features boating fun on the Puget Sound, peaceful trails, driftwood scattered beaches, island camping and views of the Seattle skyline and Mt. Rainier.

BOATING FEATURES

Blake Island offers 1,500 feet of moorage dock and 23 mooring buoys. Electrical service is available at the docks for a fee. Moorage fees are charged year-round for mooring at docks, floats, and buoys from 1 p.m. to 8 a.m. All moorage is first-come, first-served and stays are limited to 3 consecutive nights. Boats larger than 45ft are not permitted to moor at buoys. Daily and annual moorage permits are available at the park. The park offers phone in buoy registration. Phone number is on the mooring buoy and payments can be made by credit card.

FACILITIES AND CAMPING

Blake Island Marine State Park offers a large day-use area with picnic tables and BBQ braziers. There are over 7 miles of hiking and biking trails perfect for wildlife viewing and relaxing in nature. Our saltwater beaches are perfect for clamming, crabbing, fishing, diving, or taking in the sun. Overnight camping is available year-round. There are 44 standard sites, select sites are reservable May 15 - Sept 15, and three sites on the Cascadia Marine Trail. Two picnic shelters and group accommodation are available for reservations. Group camp includes an Adirondack shelter with bunks for eight guests and grass area for tents, 50-person max. A Park store is available with a variety of snacks, ice, fire logs, and souvenirs.
