

THINGS TO REMEMBER

- Park hours are 6:30 a.m. to dusk, April 1 to Sept. 30. Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.
- Winter schedule is Oct. 1 to March 31, 8 a.m. to dusk. Although most parks are open year-round, some parks or portions of parks are closed during the winter. For a winter schedule and information about seasonal closures, call the information center at 360-902-8844 or visit parks.wa.gov.
- Wildlife, plants and all park buildings, signs, tables and other structures are protected; removal or damage of any kind is prohibited. Hunting, feeding of wildlife and gathering firewood on state park property is prohibited.
- **One camping party is allowed per site.** Maximum of eight people per campsite. Campsites may not be held for other parties.
- Camping check-in time is 2:30 p.m., and check-out time is 1 p.m.
- Extra vehicle overnight - \$10 per night in designated area for each vehicle in excess of the one allowed per site. Does not apply to vehicle towed by a recreational vehicle.
- Pets must be on leash and under physical control at all times. This includes trail areas and campsites. Pet owners must clean up after pets on all state park lands.
- Engine-driven electric generators may be operated only between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 p.m.

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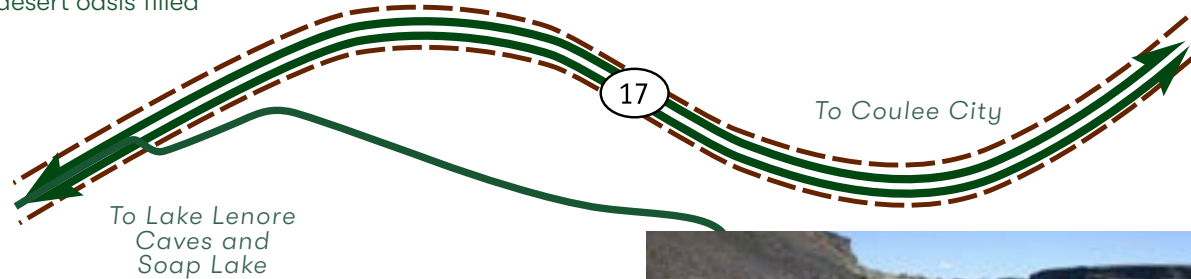
WELCOME TO SUN LAKES-DRY FALLS STATE PARK

Sun Lakes-Dry Falls is a 3,774-acre camping park with 73,640 feet of freshwater shoreline at the foot of Dry Falls. Dry Falls is one of the great geological wonders of North America. Carved by Ice-Age floods that long ago disappeared, the former waterfall is now a stark cliff, 400 feet high and 3.5 miles wide. In its heyday, the waterfall was four times the size of Niagara Falls. Today, it overlooks a desert oasis filled with lakes and abundant wildlife.

The park's dramatic landscape was formed by Ice-Age floods that swept through the area 15,000 years ago. The park and the interesting exhibits at Dry Falls Visitor Center offer many opportunities for people to learn about this unusual landscape. Special programs, hikes, talks and classroom visits are available by appointment, through the visitor center at (509) 632-5214.



AMENITIES + FACILITIES

- Two boat ramps, 680 feet of dock and 42 moorage slips. Call Grant County at (509) 754-2011 for boating ordinance questions.
- 90 unsheltered picnic tables, available first come, first served
- Restrooms with showers
- Trailer dump station
- 8 miles of moderate to difficult hiking trails
- 9 freshwater lakes, 7 w/ trout fishing

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS

- 96 standard campsites complete with fire rings. Tent sites do not have tent pads. Be prepared for the possibility of heavy winds.
- 41 full-hookup utility sites with a maximum site length of 65 feet
- Group camp site for up to 75 people. This site allows only tents, no RVs.

SUN LAKES RESORT is located within the park and offers a park store, laundromat, boat rentals, propane, firewood, cabins, a commissary, nine-hole golf course and a miniature golf course. The resort can be reached at (509) 632-5291.
