OCTOBER COMMISSION MEETING RECAP

WASHINGTON STATE PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION



The Commission visited Clarkston this month and toured several state parks in the area and across the border, including Hells Gate State Park and the Nez Perce National Historic Park Visitor Center in Idaho.

COMMISSION MEETING

Item E-1: Beebe Bridge Park Management Agreement

This item asked the Commission to delegate authority to the Director to enter into a management agreement for Beebe Bridge Park in Douglas County. The Chelan County Public Utility District approached State Parks staff to ask whether we might have interest in managing Beebe Bridge Park. The 56-acre Beebe Bridge Park is the only park currently managed by the PUD that offers camping. It has 46 tent/RV sites with electricity and water. This request was unanimously approved.

Item E-2: Cama Beach State Park

This item asked the Commission to not reopen the cabins, where they currently sit, at Cama Beach State Park. Significant septic and infrastructure failures led to the closure of the cabins and other buildings in the beach area of park in February 2024. In addition to this issue, winter storms severely damaged the already compromised seawall along the beach and impacts of rising sea levels will only increase in the coming years. There are also known cultural and historical complexities that impact the sustainability of reopening the cabins. Day use in the area remains open. This request was unanimously approved.

Item E-3: Palouse to Cascades State Park Trail - Ellensburg perpetual public road crossing easement

This item asked the Commission to delegate to the Director authority to enter into a Perpetual Easement Agreement with the City of Ellensburg for a public road crossing, a utility crossing, and maintenance on the Palouse to Cascades State Park Trail. In 2023, MLC Laird Holdings II LLC applied for an easement with State Parks for two road crossings over the trail for the Foster North Development. The Development property was annexed into the City and is included in the City's Comprehensive Plan. This request was unanimously approved.

Item E-4: Riverside State Park - Glen Tana long-term boundary and land classification update

This item asked the Commission to approve an update to the long-term boundary and land classifications for Riverside State Park. This change would allow for the future acquisition of the Glen Tana property. Glen Tana is a 1,060-acre property near the eastern edge of Riverside. It contains riparian habitat, wetlands, open grasslands and upland forests of ponderosa pine. The property also has nearly two miles of the aquifer-fed Little Spokane River. It is positioned between the existing edges of Riverside and the Waikiki Springs Nature Preserve and Wildlife area, approximately 200 acres owned by Inland Northwest Land Conservancy and the State Department of Fish and Wildlife. Glen Tana is the critical link between these sites, offering expanded recreational and habitat connectivity of the Little Spokane River Natural Area. This request was unanimously approved.

Real Estate Program Manager Ken Graham presented three requests to the Commission for consideration: Amendment of a 40 year easement agreement with Spokane County Parks, granting a 30-year easement agreement with the City of Spokane and a change to the current land classifications for both properties. The Commission will take action on these proposals at its regular meeting in January 2025.
