PASSHOLDER RULES

- Don't alter, make copies or let others use your pass.
- There is a \$15 replacement fee.
- This pass can't be used with any other pass or discount.
- You must cancel reservations if you're unable to use them.
- The pass holder must register and be present to receive a discount.
- Your pass must be with you during your stay. Be prepared to show the pass and photo ID.
- The camping discount is only for the pass holder's site. Discounts are limited to 1 campsite or moorage site per night.
- Don't make duplicate or multiple reservations for the same nights. Including double sites.
- Campsites and moorage are for recreational use only. Stay limits apply, see park rules.
- Pass holders are expected to treat park staff with respect, follow park rules and staff guidance.

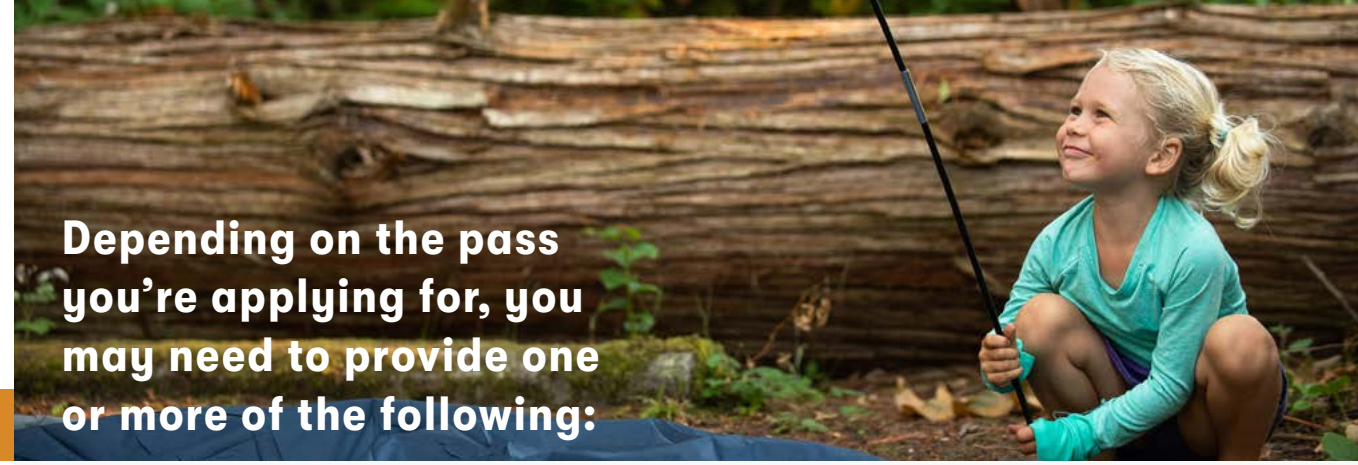

PASS PROGRAM OPTIONS

The Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission offers several passes that provide discounts on park fees for senior citizens, people with disabilities, veterans with disabilities and foster families. If you are eligible for more than one type of pass, you may receive multiple passes. You may only use one pass or discount per reservation. Passes and discounts do not apply to the purchase of annual permits.



Depending on the pass you're applying for, you may need to provide one or more of the following:

Disability Pass (1-year and 5-year) Provides access to ADA sites	50% off nightly camping or moorage fees. Free day-use access and parking fees, watercraft launch and trailer dump fees. Stay limits apply.	FREE	Proof of residency and disability. See inside for details.	Green (five-year) Red (one-year) 
Disabled Veteran Lifetime Pass Provides access to ADA sites	Free day-use access and parking fees, watercraft launch and trailer dump fees. Stay limits apply.	FREE	Proof of residency and service-connected disability of at least 30%. See inside for details.	Green 
Foster Family Pass (2-year pass)	Free camping and day-use access to state parks. Must camp with youth experiencing foster care or kinship care. Stay limits apply.	FREE	Proof of residency and in-home care. See reverse side for details.	Purple 

Passes may take up to 30 days for processing and mailing.

- Proof of residency:** You must be a Washington state resident. To prove residency, show a copy of your Washington state driver license or ID card, voter registration card or property tax exemption statement.
- Proof of age:** For Senior citizen passes, you must be 62 or older. To prove age, show your Washington state driver license or ID card, other proof may be accepted.
- Proof of income:** Eligibility is based on a total household income of \$40,000 or less, including social security, from the previous tax year. You are also eligible if you meet the requirements for a property tax exemption for your county under WAC 352-32-251.
- Proof of disabled veteran status:** Provide a recent VA award letter showing your combined rating of at least 30%.
- Proof of foster home care:** Eligible foster and kinship caregivers may provide a letter of certification or license from DCYF, DSHS, notification form from a kinship navigator or a tribal government. Don't see

yourself represented here? Call or email us. *Please note: Youth experiencing foster care must arrive and camp with the caregiver for the entire length of overnight stays and must be with the caregiver for day use visits.*

- Proof of disability:** You may qualify for the Disability Pass if you are: Legally blind, profoundly deaf, developmentally disabled, permanently disabled and/or temporarily disabled. If you don't see yourself represented here but believe you are eligible, call or email us. Proof of disability must be provided in the form of: 1) A letter from a state or federal agency stating you are receiving or have been approved for disability benefits. 2) A Disabled Parking Placard ID card issued by Washington Dept. of Licensing.
