



Recreation Perspectives





Convergence of Interests

- Long-term goal of state agencies to develop resource management capacity
- Formal request for action to Governor by Federallyrecognized Treaty Tribes through Northwest Indian Fisheries Commission
- Pandemic-related acceleration of recreation and obvious impacts
- Window of opportunity to clarify Government-to-Government relationship and obligations













State-Tribal Recreation Impacts Initiative (STRII)

31 federally recognized tribes with protected rights in Washington

Recreation and Conservation Office












Desired Outcomes

- Improved condition and on-going conservation of natural and cultural resources
- Protection of Tribal rights and interests
- High-quality, sustainable recreational opportunities and experiences available to the public
- Improved cooperation and working relationship among independent state agencies and Tribes
- Defendable recreation management decisions


Vision

Tribes and state agencies work together to co-develop recreation management tools and an adaptive management framework that effectively coordinates cooperative stewardship of natural and cultural resources and preserves protected tribal rights on state lands.




Goals

- Share information and receive informal feedback on recreation policy, programs, projects, and initiatives
- Develop a technical process to:
 - Identify and prioritize locations where recreation may be causing degradation of natural or cultural resources,
 - Assess potential impacts of recreation consistently across state lands,
 - Identify management strategies to avoid or mitigate recreation impacts.




Relation to Agency Tribal Consultation

- Not considered Consultation
- Multi-Tribe-multi-agency coordination
- Does not replace G2G consultation processes
- G2G consultation can be initiated any time



Organizational Structure and Lines of Effort



Tribal and state caucuses meet independently as necessary

Information Sharing Workgroup

- Review and approve charter
- Develop Integrated plan
- Share project and program information

Technical Workgroup

 Develop and implement technical assessment and adaptive management framework

Legislative Workgroup

- Coordinate budget requests
- Review legislation and proposed budgets

Guiding Documents

Charter

Provides background, sets roles and responsibilities and guides communication and decision making for the initiative's work

Integrated Plan

- Synthesizes and links to DNR, DFW, and State Parks recreation information and plans
- Describes plan for STRII efforts for the next few years




STRII Charter Content


- Background
- Vision
- Communication principles
- Organizational structure, meetings, participants, and assignments
- Decision making process



STRII Charter Considerations

- Procedural guidance for the initiative only
- Joint advice to state agency and Tribal leadership
- Integrates into existing Tribal and state agency decision making processes and policies (including SEPA, APA)
- Working on language connecting to Integrated Plan





STRII Charter Adoption

- Tribal-state agency leadership review (May '24)
- Working charter in use (May '24 Jan '25)
- Updated charter circulated for review by Tribes and state agencies (Feb – Mar '25)
- Finalize charter and transmit to leaders (April '25)
- Adoption of finalized charter by Tribal and state agency leaders by consensus (June '25)



Next Steps

Remainder of 2023-25 biennium

- Complete draft of Integrated Plan
- Complete development of process to identify and prioritize areas to implement technical framework on areas with at-risk natural resources
- Identify 3-4 pilot project locations to apply, test, and refine technical framework
- Tribal-State Agency Leadership Assembly (June 2025)

2025-27 Biennium

- Implement pilot projects
- Refine technical framework and expand to include cultural resources
- Continue information sharing improvements
