(yes or no) Yes. A 0.3 mile loop was groomed on a park ballfield area for use by beginners and by Special Olympics athletes practicing snowshoeing and skiing. Permission was not obtained from the Winter Rec program to groom this loop; however, the practice events were an event authorized by the park. This loop will not be groomed in 2025-26.
