Item E-2: Financial Update - Report

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: This item reports to the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission on 1) State Parks' 2023-25 biennium final financial report, the status of 2) the 2025-27 biennium operating and capital budget expenditures, 3) Parks Renewal and Stewardship Account (PRSA) revenue, and 4) the 2025-27 Budget Development. This item advances the Commission's goal: "Obtain and effectively manage resources needed to create and sustain an exceptional park system".

LAST BIENNIUM FINANCIAL INFORMATION

2023-25 Biennium Operating Budget and Expenditures: State Parks' 2023-25 biennial operating budget was \$273.2 million, including supplemental funding. The budget that funded general operations was \$245.8 million with dedicated program funding at \$27.4 million. Of the \$245.8 million, \$87.1 million was supported by tax dollars from the General Fund (GF-S),\$5.3 million from Climate accounts, and the remaining \$153.2 million was supported by earned revenue (PRSA).

For the last biennium, the agency spent \$254.9 million; of which \$230.7 million was for general operations. The PRSA ending fund balance as of June 30, 2025, was \$21.7 million. At the beginning of the last biennium, July 1, 2023, PRSA started with a fund balance of \$20.2 million.

2023-25 Biennium Capital Budget and Expenditures: State Parks' 2023-25 capital budget was \$201.1 million. \$143.3 million was from the State Building and Construction Account and comprised of \$77.2 million for new projects and \$66.1 million for reappropriated projects and \$2.4 million was from the Climate account. In addition, available grant and other spending authority dollars was \$55.4 million.

For the last biennium, the agency spent a total of \$22.5 million on new projects, \$40.9 million on reappropriated projects, \$0.8 million from the Climate accounts and \$22.5 million on grant related projects.

2023-25 Biennium Revenue (PRSA): PRSA earned revenue includes Discover Pass sales, camping, cabins & other overnight accommodations, "opt-out" donations through the Department of Licensing and other earned revenue.

The 2023-25 earned revenue forecast was \$136.9 million and "actual" earned revenue was \$141.1 million, for a \$4.2 million (3.0 percent) positive variance.

Comparing actual against estimates by major categories:

- 1) Discover Pass revenue was 5.0 percent (\$2.5 million) above projection
- 2) Camping revenue was 2.8 percent (\$1.4 million) below projection
- 3) Cabins and other lodging revenue was 17.0 percent (\$1.3 million) below projection
- 4) Donations through the DOL "opt out" program was 2.8 percent (\$419,700) below projection
- 5) Other revenue sources was 29.5 percent (\$4.7 million) above projection

CURRENT BIENNIUM FINANCIAL INFORMATION

2025-27 Biennium Operating Budget and Expenditures: State Parks' 2025-27 biennial operating budget is \$257.6 million. The amount of budget that funds general operations is \$234.7 million with dedicated program funding at \$22.1 million. Of the \$234.7 million, \$65.9 million is supported by tax dollars from the General Fund (GF-S), \$1.2 million is in the Transportation budget and \$980,000 is from climate account funds. The remaining \$166.7 million is supported by earned revenue (PRSA).

As of August 31, the agency spent \$20.4 million; of which \$19.6 million was for general operations. Overall, spending for general operations (GF-S / PRSA) is 8.4 percent of the biennial spending plan.

The August 31, PRSA ending fund balance was \$29.4 million, \$8.5 million greater than the may 2025 ending balance of \$20.9 million. The projected June 2027 fund ending balance is \$4.7 million.

2025-27 Biennium Capital Budget and Expenditures: State Parks' 2025-27 capital budget is \$147.2 million. \$113.3 million is from the State Building and Construction Account and is comprised of \$33.8 million for new projects and \$79.4 million for reappropriated projects. \$1.7 million is from the new climate account funds. In addition, available grant and other spending authority dollars currently total \$34.0 million though this amount is expected to increase roughly \$20 million in the following months as agreements are established and allotted.

As of August 31, the agency spent or encumbered a total of \$33.1 million; \$62,798 on new projects (\$62,798 spent, \$0 encumbered), \$33.0 million on reappropriated projects (\$2.1 million spent, \$30.9 million encumbered), and \$3.8 million on climate and grant related projects.

2025-27 Biennium Revenue (PRSA): PRSA earned revenue includes Discover Pass sales, camping, cabins & other overnight accommodations, "opt-out" donations through the Department of Licensing and other earned revenue.

The 2025-27 earned revenue forecast is currently \$149.7 million. As of August 31, "actual" earned revenue was \$21.3 million, \$377,998 (1.8 percent) below biennium-to-date estimates.

Comparing biennium-to-date revenue collections against estimates by major categories:

- 1) Discover Pass revenue is 2.4 percent (\$152,372) below projection
- 2) Camping revenue is 5.6 percent (\$602,421) below projection
- 3) Cabins and other lodging revenue is 2.7 percent (\$25,698) below projection
- 4) Donations through the DOL "opt out" program is 3.7 percent (\$50,845) below projection
- 5) Other revenue sources are 24.6 percent (\$453,338) above projection

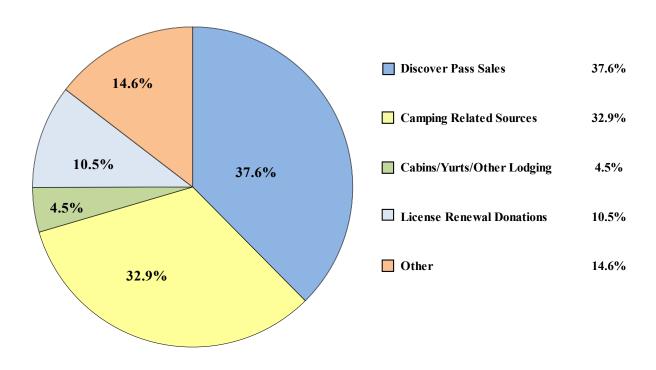

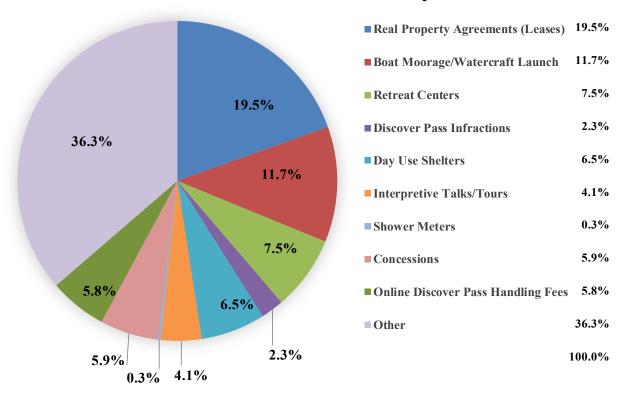

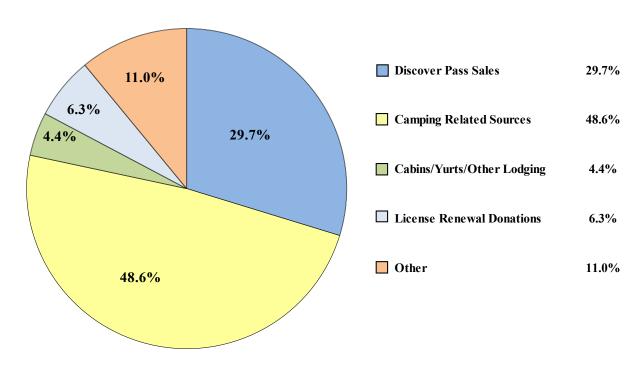
