This amendment will grant the proponent an option to extend their lease term from sixty-two (62) to eighty (80) years, consistent with 2025’s Second Substitute House Bill 1024 (see *Appendix 4: Saint Edward State Park: Final Bill Report 2SHB 1024*), concerning the agency’s leasing authority at Saint Edward State Park.
